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Cancer Of The Head And Neck
Head and neck cancer is a relatively uncommon type of cancer. Around 12,000 new cases are diagnosed in the UK each year. There are more than 30 areas within the head and neck where cancer can develop, including the: mouth and lips; voice box (larynx) throat (pharynx) salivary glands; nose and sinuses; area at the back of the nose and mouth (nasopharynx)

Cancer in the head and neck region may affect your mouth (oral cavity), tongue, parts of the throat (pharynx), nose or nasal sinuses, salivary glands, gums, tonsils, voice-box (larynx) and middle ear. Globally, approximately 550,000 people are diagnosed with head and neck cancer (HNC) every year.

What Is the Most Common Head and Neck Cancer?
This year, an estimated 65,630 people (48,200 men and 17,430 women) will develop head and neck cancer. It is estimated that 14,500 deaths (10,760 men and 3,740 women) from head and neck cancer will occur this year. The 5-year survival rate tells you what percent of people live at least 5 years after the cancer is found.

Swelling in one or more lymph nodes in the neck is a common symptom of head and neck cancer, including mouth cancer and salivary gland cancer. Lumps that come and go are not typically due to cancer. Cancer usually forms a lump that slowly gets bigger.

Laryngeal cancer - starts in the voice box. Hypopharyngeal cancer - starts in the lower part of the throat beside and behind the voice box. The most common type of cancer in the head and neck area is called carcinoma. These cancers start in the cells that line all parts of the nose, mouth, and throat.
