The theory encourages learners to actively participate in the learning experience and directs selection of teaching methods that promote experiential learning. Information about entry behaviors, attitudes toward content and delivery method, academic motivation, general learning preferences, and group characteristics are very useful and influential in guiding the design of instruction.

Applying learning theories and instructional design models ...

Use different teaching methods in one session to keep the students' attention and to reach students who have different learning preferences. (See Teaching with Lectures.) Allow for pauses and "wait-time." Wait-time is the pause after the instructor either asks a question or asks for questions.
